Federal regulations require all passengers to review this important information, for their safety. Follow these instructions, illuminated cabin signs, posted placards, and oral directions and hand signals given by crew members.

Know the location and operation of all emergency equipment and exits.

In an emergency evacuation, if a crew member cannot reach an exit near you, you may have to open it.

ONLY open the exit after the plane has completely come to a stop.

Look outside: If fire, smoke, or water could come in through the exit, do not open it, direct passengers to usable exits.

If it is safe to open the exit, open it quickly and clear a pathway in the row to the exit.

Shout "Open seatbelts!", "Come this way!" and exit the airplane as quickly as possible.

Help other passengers out of the airplane, if there is no immediate danger.

Direct passengers to a safe path away and quickly get yourself clear of the airplane.


Bracing positions

Know the location and operation of all exits.

Using the exits, quickly evacuate the aircraft.

Before opening an exit, quickly look through a window to check outside for the following:



Smoke



If smoke is so thick you can not see out, redirect passengers to other exits.




If there is fire outside the aircraft, redirect passengers to other exits.



Debris



If there is metal debris or obstructions, redirect passengers to other exits.

At take-off and landing










Fasten your seatbelt when the 'Seatbelt' sign is lighted. Keep your seatbelt on while seated.

After landing, keep your seatbelt fastened until the aircraft has come to a complete stop at the gate and the 'Seatbelt' sign has been turned off!





Flotation Cushion


