

KLM/NW Marketing Ties Grow By Increased Code Sharing

Northwest and KLM have expanded their "code sharing" to build their respective presence in Europe and North America.

Currently KLM flights from Amsterdam to Detroit and Minneapolis/St. Paul use the NW code in addition to KL. Also, certain KLM flights between Amsterdam and Copenhagen, Oslo, Stockholm, Munich Geneva, and Zurich are flown with the NW code in addition to KL.

Alternately, selected Northwest flights between Detroit and Minnea-polis/St. Paul, Chicago and the Twin Cities, and between both Detroit and the Twin Cities and Dallas/Ft. Worth are flown with the KL code in addition to NW.

It is not inconceivable that Mesaba flights may someday be flown with a "KL" designater in addition to "NW".

Mesaba Announces Intention To Service Thunder Bay, Ontario

Minneapolis/St. Paul - December 15, 1992 - Mesaba Aviation, Inc. expects to receive final approval to serve Thunder Bay, Ontario from the National Transportation Agency of Canada in the near future.

In our license application, Mesaba filed for approval to provide daily non-stop service between Minneapolis/St. Paul and Thunder Bay. We intend to begin service as early as March, 1993 and

will be making more detailed service information available in the next few weeks.

Mesaba currently provides scheduled airline service to forty-three cities in fifteen states as well as two cities in Ontario—London and Hamilton. Mesaba is also one of the largest regional airlines in North America.

AirTran Redeems Stock Held by Northwest Airlines

December 24, 1992

AirTran Corporation announced today an agreement to redeem \$8,000,000 of AirTran stock held by Northwest Airlines' subsidiary Northwest Aircraft. Inc. The AirTran Board of Directors have approved the buy-back of 1.000,000 shares at \$8.00 per share. Northwest will be entitled to an additional \$1.00 per share on July 1, 1994. under certain circumstances, including a requirement that AirTran's averaged closing bid price exceeds \$12.00 per share during a 20-day consecutive period in June, 1994. Northwest retains ownership of 189,272 shares and continues to hold warrants for an additional 1,529,862 shares of AirTran common stock. As part of the agreement, Northwest agreed to an 18-month "standstill" on the sale or exercise of remaining shares of common stock and warrants held by Northwest.

"Northwest requested that we participate in their refinancing package and we are able to do so through this stock redemption program," said AirTran Chairman Robert Swensen.

NORTHWEST NEWS

The following information has been compiled from Northwest's Employee Newswire.

- Nov. 19 KLM Royal Dutch Airlines and five of Northwest's six labor unions announced their intention to extend financial assistance to Northwest to enhance it's current and long-term viability. Lenders and other parties are working to put together a secured loan facility of a minimum of \$250 million. This should enable Northwest to take measures that will lead to a structurally healthy position.
- Nov. 19 November 18 was Northwest's first anniversary for Fastrak, it's premier service for business travelers. Northwest remains the leader in special services to business travelers.
- Nov. 24 Wayne County Officials outlined plans for a new \$368 million International Terminal at Detroit Metro Airport.

 Nov. 25 - A prominent Wall Street Analyst predicted that U.S. carriers will move toward economic health in 1993 and show extraordinary profits by 1994.

- Nov. 30 Northwest's non-stop flights from Seoul to Seattle/Tacoma and Detroit will be the last Trans-Pacific departures of the day from Kimpo International giving Northwest a competitive advantage for the business traveler.
- Dec. 1 Northwest's Worldperks
 Free Travel program received the
 highest ranking of any other air line's frequent flyer program in the
 November edition of Consumer Re ports Travel Letter.
- Dec. 3 Northwest has been named the Official Airline for the North American International Auto Show to be held January 4-17, 1993 at Detroit's Cobo Center.

- Dec. 7 Northwest closed a major financial transaction for a \$250 million credit facility provided by a consortium of lenders which includes KLM Royal Dutch Airlines, Bankers Trust, General Electric Credit Corporation, United Technologies, Airbus Industrie and ABN-AMRO Bank. The proceeds will be used to fund ongoing operations and general corporate purposes.
- Dec. 7 Northwest has reached an agreement with Airbus Industrie to cancel orders for 24 A340's and 50 A320's with a total new value of \$3.5 billion. In additions, Boeing and Northwest have agreed to delay delivery of four 747-400's and 40 757's with a net value of approximately \$2.7 billion.

FINANCIAL NEWS

SECOND QUARTER EARNINGS

Mesaba reported earnings of \$3,809,000 or 41 cents per share for the quarter ended September 30, 1992 compared to net income of \$2,903,000 or 34 cents per share for the same quarter last year.

Earnings for the six months ending September 30, 1992 were \$5,042,000 or 55 cents per share, compared to \$3,762,000 or 44 cents per share for the same period one year ago.

Robert Swenson said he was pleased with the second quarter performance including the contribution of the five new Detroit markets added during the quarter. Mesaba initiated Detroit service to Binghamton, New York, and Huntington, West Virginia in July, 1992 followed by Roanoke, Virginia in August and Lafayette, Indiana and Bloomington, Illinois in September, 1992.


Operating revenues totaled \$34,746,000 for the quarter, an increase of 22 percent from \$28,471,000 in the second quarter of last year. For the six months ended September 30, 1992, op-


erating revenues increased 20 percent to \$61,152,000 compared to \$51,140,000 in the first half of the prior year.


Revenue passenger miles increased 33 percent to 83.0 million for the current quarter compared to 62.5 million during last year's second quarter. Available seat miles for the quarter rose 23 percent to 139.4 million from 113.6 million flown last year. Mesaba's second quarter system-wide load factor was 59.6 percent, compared to 55.0 percent last year.



November Traffic

Mesaba flew 21 million revenue passenger miles during the month of November, a 30 percent increase when compared with 16.1 million revenue passenger miles flown during the same month last year (a revenue passenger mile equals one passenger flown one mile). Mesaba carried 102,163 passengers during the month, an increase of 25.2 percent over 81,573 passengers carried last November. Our load factor in

Passengers carried: Available seat miles: Revenue passenger miles: System-wide load factor: November was 45.2 percent compared with 51.4 percent during the same month one year ago.

Robert Swenson, Chairman and CEO said "The decline in our year over year passenger load factor was due in part to the amount of new service we have implemented. While we expect to report solid profits for the quarter, we do not anticipate matching the record results of

last year's third fiscal quarter. Since Northwest has announced the completion of its refinancing package we have seen passenger bookings rebound and we remain optimistic about our next quarter and future trends. Further, the implementation of our new deHavilland Dash 8 aircraft is proceeding on schedule and passenger acceptance has been extremely favorable."

CURRENT NEWS EVENTS

MESABA DASH 8 UPDATE

It's hard to believe it has been almost a year since we announced that Mesaba would take delivery of 25 Dash 8-100 aircraft. We are now more than halfway through the delivery program. We will be flying 14 of the 37-seaters in scheduled service in January, with two remaining unscheduled for sparing, maintenance and training needs. If all goes as planned, the remainder of the 25-aircraft order will be delivered by September, 1993.

The Dash 8 fleet has been placed in a variety of missions. Some have been used to start operations at new cities. Others have been put into service at existing markets and have replaced former Metro III or Fokker F27 flying. The new aircraft have been positioned primarily on the eastern side of the Mesaba

route system. Passenger acceptance for the Dash-8's has been excellent. In many cases, it appears that operating a Dash-8 on a former F27 flight actually stimulates demand for the flight.

Simultaneous with the buildup of Dash 8 flying has been a decrease and consolidation of F27 services. Effective with the February 1993 schedule, our remaining eight F27 aircraft will be based out of the MSP hub although few flight segments will continue to "touch" the Detroit hub on a daily basis. The consolidation of F27 operations at one hub will enable the company to keep costs associated with that aircraft type to a minimum.

We expect to see more new cities out of both hubs in the next nine months as well as more replacement of current Metro III and Fokker 27 flying by the Dash 8's which are yet to enter the fleet. However, don't expect to see the Dash 8's everywhere! In some cases, our existing Metro flights haven't flown to a point where we feel we can support larger aircraft on a consistent basis. As for Minneapolis-based F27 cities, as long as we have the F27's in the fleet, we must be sure that these large aircraft are positioned in the heaviest traffic-producing cities. We know that all stations want Dash 8 service, but we need to work realistically with the passenger demand and fleet limitations,

More Relaxed Travel Dress Code For Mesaba And Northwest

First/Executive Class

Male: Suit or Sport coat with slacks and shirt, sweater or turtleneck. If a Sport Coat is not worn, a tie must be worn with dress shirt and slacks. Shoes with socks.

Female: Dress, Suit (jacket with skirt/slacks combination) or skirt, slacks with coordinated blouse/sweater/turtleneck. Shoes (heals or flats) with hosiery. Culottes and stirrup pants are acceptable.

Children under 8 years of age are not allowed in First or Executive Class.

Children (under age 16)

Male: Coordinated shirt/sweater/turtleneck and slacks. Shoes with socks (including neat appearing athletic type shoes).

Female: Dress or skirt/slacks with coordinated sweater/blouse. Shoes with socks (including neat appearing athletic type shoes).

Coach Class:

Pass and reduced rate travelers not dressed as shown above will be accommodated in coach. Neat appearing ath-

letic type shoes/sandals with socks will be permitted in Coach Class. Children under 8 years of age may wear a coordinated shorts outfit.

Unacceptable Boarding Attire:

Any denim garments, sweatsuits, sweatshirts, t-shirts, tank-tops, shorts (except children under 8 years old in coach), leggings, bare midriffs, shoes without socks or hosiery. Ski jackets, all-weather jackets and flight bomber type jackets are not acceptable as sport coats in First or Executive Class.
