Hangar Officially Dedicated

New Corporate Logo Unveiled at Event

Mesaba officially dedicated its new Minneapolis/St. Paul maintenance hangar and office facility in a ceremony on April 19th. The event was held in the company's new facility and featured speeches by Robert Swenson, President of Air-Tran, A.B. Sky Magary, Vice President of Marketing for Northwest and Jeff Hamiel, Executive Vice President of Metropolitan Airports Commission.

"This newly constructed facility reflects the commitment that we have made to growth as a company providing quality regional airline services to this region," said Rob Swenson to the crowd of nearly 300 attending guests and employees. Invited and attending guests included members of the state legislature, M.A.C., Twin Cities financial community, Northwest Airlines, leaders from cities served by Mesaba and other friends and associates of the company.

Mesaba broke ground on the new hangar in April 1988 and it took seven months to construct. The Company moved into the \$4.5 million dollar facility in November of 1988 and waited for warmer weather before officially dedicating the building.

The hangar features nearly 80,000 square foot of space, 53,000 of which is designated solely towards maintenance area and related space. The other portion of the building features three floors of offices for the Company. The hangar will accommodate up to six or more aircraft at the same time.

In addition to the speeches, the dedication featured tours of the new building given by Mesaba employees.

Mesaba also formally unveiled a new corporate logo for its holding company, AirTran Corporation, during Mr. Swenson's presentation. A look at the new logo and story may

Central Wisconsin Hangar Purchased

Mesaba announced that it has purchased an aircraft maintenance facility located at Central Wisconsin Airport in Mosinee, Wisconsin. The airline obtained the facility, formerly used by Midstate Airlines, from a group of investors located in the Central Wisconsin region.

The hangar, built in 1982, features approximately 38,000 square feet of space, the majority of which is maintenance and related shop space. The facility is the largest aircraft hangar located at Central Wisconsin Airport.

Lawrence McCabe, Mesaba Vice President of Government and Corporate Affairs, said the airline has not finalized its long range plans for the facility, but said it will continue utilizing the building for aircraft cleaning and other minor aircraft maintenance work. The company has leased the



Letter From The President

MAY 1989

Dear Employees,

I am pleased to report that month to date in May, we are operating at an approximate 82% system-wide on-time rate, which is 1% better than the best major airline. Our completion rate in May to date has been approximately 95%. Clearly, we still have some improvements to make; however, I am happy to report that as additional aircraft are delivered to us,



our operating reliability is beginning to show strong improvement. Our internal company goal is to achieve an 85% on-time rate and a 99% completion rate. I hope that with your help we can make those numbers real very soon.

Additional aircraft are continuing to arrive. In May, we signed an agreement to obtain two additional Metro III aircraft, which will bring our Metro fleet to sixteen aircraft. Those two airplanes, which we are leasing from Northwest Aircraft, Inc., will be put in service in June to help us meet our scheduled service plans. We also recently took delivery of our tenth F27 which will go in service shortly. We are expecting an additional four F27s this summer and one more F27 to be delivered later this year.

I hope that many of you will be able to attend this year's company family picnic which is scheduled for Saturday, June 10 at Fort Snelling State Park in St. Paul. This event is always a fun time for employees and their family members. I hope to see you there.

Mesaba Reports April Traffic

The Company reported that it carried 50,852 passengers during the month of April, a 73% percent increase over 29,322 passengers flown during the same month last year. Mesaba said it had a system-wide load factor in April of 52.2%, compared to a load factor of 49.3% last year.

The airline's traffic figures have shown a considerable increase in recent months, reflecting new service implemented beginning last December at Detroit Metropolitan Airport, the carrier's newest hub operation.

Mesaba serves 33 airports in ten Midwest states.

Two Metro III's Ordered

Mesaba announced on May 16 that it has signed agreements for two additional Metro III aircraft which it expects to take delivery of in May of this year. Mesaba is leasing the aircraft through Northwest Aircraft Inc., a subsidiary of NWA Inc. The two

aircraft were formerly operated by Air Midwest.

The addition of those two aircraft increases to sixteen the number of 19-passenger Metro III aircraft that Mesaba operates in its fleet. The two aircraft are scheduled to go in service in June.

10th Fokker Delivered

The Company took delivery of its tenth Fokker F27 aircraft recently. The aircraft is the fourth F27 to be delivered in conjunction with the company's expansion to the Detroit hub.

The aircraft was formerly operated by British Midland Airlines in England.

Painted in a new white and red paint scheme, the aircraft is scheduled to go in service in mid-May. Officials from Mesaba say they expect to receive four additional F27 aircraft this summer and one more later this year to round out orders that were put in place for planning the Detroit expansion.

The airline operates as Northwest Airlink under a marketing agreement with Northwest Airlines and currently provides Central Wisconsin Airport with six round-trip flights to Minneapolis/St. Paul, two round-trip flights to Detroit and two round-trip flights to Milwaukee.



cial appearance by summer fun clowns to play games with the children.


All food and refreshments will be



Employee Benefits: Bereavement/Funeral Leave Changes

The Company has amended its Bereavement/Funeral Leave Benefit to reflect the following changes:

Effective April 1, 1989, all full-time employees of Mesaba will have available a paid leave of absence for the purposes of bereavement and/or attending the funeral services of a family mem-

ber. The absence must take place between the time of the death and up to one day after the funeral.

Three days paid bereavement leave will be paid for the death of the following employee's family member: spouse, child, mother, father, brother, sister, mother-in-law, father-in-law or step parent.

Two days paid bereavement leave will be paid for the death of the following employee's family member: Grandparent, grandchild, brother-in-law or sister-in-law.

Compensation will be paid only for the time that the employee would have been scheduled to work and the pay will be computed at the regular hourly rate to a maximum of eight hours for one day. Pay for bereavement leave will not be considered for purposes of overtime.

An employee's request to use unpaid sick leave or accumulated vacation in the event of a death, in addition to the paid leave, will also be considered by the company.
