## \*\*\* MESABA RECEIVES MICHIGAN AFRONAUTICS AWARD \*\*\*

The Michigan Aeronautics Commission (MAC) selected Mesaba this year as the recipient of the "Award of Excellence," an annual award presented to an individual or organization whose contributions have led to significant improvements to facilities, services, operations or public relations for aviation in Michigan.

"Mesaba Airlines continues to address and accommodate the changing air service requirements of Michigan communities," said Daniel Knopper, Chairman of MAC. Mesaba Vice President Larry McCabe was in Bay Harbor, Michigan on September 19 to receive the award on behalf of Mesaba.

The company currently provides service to eight cities in Michigan. Statewide, Mesaba employs 340 persons, operates 74 daily departures and carried over 250,000 passengers year to date through mid-September in Michigan.

# \*\*\* MINNEAPOLIS/ST. PAUL OPERATIONS GOES BACK TO GOLD \*\*\*

Mesaba's Minneapolis/St. Paul Station Operations moved back to the Gold Concourse in August, after being located on the Green Concourse all summer due to airport construction. All of the company's flights in the Twin Cities now arrive and depart at Gate 15 on the Gold Concourse.

# \*\*\* MESABA TO INCREASE DETROIT SERVICE \*\*\*

Effective November 15, Mesaba will increase service to Detroit by adding one round-trip flight between Detroit and Kalamazoo, Cincinnati, Columbus and Lansing. All of the new service will be with Fokker F27 aircraft and will complement existing Northwest Airline service at those cities. Mesaba already provides service to Kalamazoo, Cincinnati and Columbus. To accommodate the expansion, Mesaba will be acquiring one F27 aircraft. On November 15, Mesaba will be providing service to 38 cities in ten states.

#### PRESIDENT'S LETTER

Dear Employee:

Greetings! I hope that you are preparing for the approaching winter season and enjoying autumn. There is a lot of news to report to you.

Effective October 1, we have increased pay schedules for hourly employees. Affected employees should be receiving information in early October. I am pleased that we are able to continue enhancing wages and benefits during these difficult times.

As many of you recall, last spring I put a hiring freeze on most positions due to what I perceived as a capacity and cost problem on Mesaba's side, along with lowered passenger demand across the country. In the following months, many major airlines began hiring freezes as well. Now, as you well know, many carriers are furloughing employees and asking for concessions.

Throughout this time period, we have resisted furloughs even though we have been long personnel in certain positions. I am pleased that we have been successful in securing additional Fokker flying for the Fall that will help us better utilize our existing personnel. It is up to all of us to enhance productivity and to work as efficiently as possible.

On that note, effective November 15, we are increasing service at Detroit by adding flights at Lansing, Cincinnati, Columbus and Kalamazoo. To do this, we are re-leasing F27 #60AN, which we turned back to SAAB in August. However, #60AN will be coming back to Mesaba after a "D" check and as requested, with a brand new paint scheme. I had even asked if we could change the N number, so as not to be recognizable by our employees! Treat her well, please.

On the issue of new aircraft, we are continuing to explore a number of options with regard to aircraft acquisition plans. Although we may lease additional Fokkers and Metros, at this time we do not see a new aircraft type arriving at Mesaba during the next twelve months.

Rising fuel prices have gotten a lot of attention over the past nine weeks, as well they should. Jet fuel for Mesaba has increased from approximately \$.60 to over \$1.00 per gallon in just two months. While that is extreme, it is important to note that rising fuel costs do not impact us as severely as the major airlines since we operate more fuel efficient jet prop aircraft. Historically, fuel has accounted for less than 15 percent of our total costs, (compared to over 20 percent for majors).

You will be pleased to learn that we have enhanced our vacation policy. Mesaba's Board of Directors has approved an additional two days of vacation a year for employees who have been with the Company for five years or more. The new policy increases vacation time from 10 days to 12 days after five years.

Further, it is also our objective by next year, to reward extra vacation time to employees who have accrued unused sick leave time. Employees meeting longevity criteria will be able to convert up to one half of their accrued sick time into the following year's vacation time.

While we don't want people coming to work sick, many employees have expressed their concern over our current "use it or lose it" policy. We plan to put this new policy in place once the computer software and final details are finished.

In closing, we have had too much aircraft damage on the ground. Each one of us must continue to ensure that safety is our number one priority.

Mesaba broke boarding records in July and August, carrying more passengers than ever before on its airline system. The company carried 96,682 passengers in July and 101,094 passengers in August. Revenue passenger miles (one passenger flown one mile equals one revenue passenger mile) were 20.8 million and 21.4 million in July and August, respectively. Mesaba's load factor during the two months was 57.8 percent and 58.6 percent.

Mesaba's new Detroit hangar is progressing steadily as the building's walls are already beginning to be put up in place. The 45,000 square foot maintenance facility is scheduled to be completed in early 1990.



The following letter was addressed to President, Mesaba Airlines

My wife and I were passengers on Northwest flight #102 from Phoenix to Minneapolis where we were to catch your flight to Brainerd on June 9th. \*\*\* RISING FUEL PRICE INCREASES COST OF DOING BUSINESS \*\*\*

Since the Mideast Crisis began in August, fuel prices have increased significantly forcing airlines twice to raise airfares to offset the rising cost of jet fuel. In August, airlines raised fares 5.1 percent. On October 1, an additional 4.2 percent is also scheduled to take place. Mesaba's fares have increased in correspondingly with Northwest fares.

# OPERATION SHOTGUN READY

The South Dakota hunting season opens on Saturday, October 20 and Mesaba's advance airline reservations for that week show signs of another busy season.
