AGRICULTURE RESTRICTIONS: Importation into the United States of plant pests, plants, plant products, meats and meat products, certain animals and animal products contrary to requirements under the U.S. agricultural laws is a federal offense. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES: Federal Aviation Administration rules provide that no person may drink alcoholic beverages aboard an aircraft unless they have been served by an airline, and no airline may serve alcoholic beverages to a person who appears to be intoxicated.

AMENITIES such as hotel accommodations, meals, phone calls and ground transport are not provided at Northwest expense except in the case of passengers traveling on Northwest international flights (except Canada) which are delayed, cancelled or misconnect to other

BAGGAGE includes all checked luggage and other articles carried by the passenger including briefcases, cameras, cosmetic cases, etc.

Passports and related travel documents, car keys, critical medicine and other necessary items should be carried in your possession whenever possible, since baggage which is checked at your departure city is not available until arrival at your destination.

Government safety regulations issued by the F.A.A. limit carry-on baggage and related personal belongings to items that are capable of being stowed under the seat in front of the passenger. Exempt from these regulations are a pocketbook or handbag, camera, binoculars and a reasonable amount of personal clothing and reading material.

In terms of size this means that carry-on baggage must be limited to items that collectively do not exceed the size of 21x15x9 in. (53x38x23 cm.). Carry-on garment bags will be limited to those which contain no more than three hangers, Items not meeting the physical dimensions for under-seat stowage can be accommodated in the heated, pressurized and ventilated cargo compartment of the aircraft, subject to tariff regulations.

Free baggage allowances are as follows: For travel between points in the U.S. and between the U.S. and Canada-two checked pieces of luggage. Passengers may also check or carry on an additional piece of baggage not exceeding 45 in. (114 cm.) in total dimensions and capable of being stowed under the seat in front of the passenger.

For travel between the U.S. or Canada and Europe or the Orient-two checked pieces of luggage and one or more pieces of carry-on baggage capable of being stowed under the seat in front of the passenger.

For travel between countries in Europe or the Orient-66 lbs. (30 kgs.) for first class and 44 lbs. (20 kgs.) for economy class.

Contact Northwest Orient for details on the acceptable maximum sizes and weight of baggage and for excess baggage rates.

Liability for baggage will not exceed \$750.00 for transportation between points in the U.S.; \$500.00 for transportation between the U.S. and Canada; and \$20.00 per kilogram (maximum \$640.00) on international journeys. A higher valuation may be declared for an additional charge. CHECK-IN AND BOARDING TIMES: Passengers are requested to check in at the departure gate at least 30 minutes before scheduled departure time of domestic flights and at least 60 minutes before scheduled departure time of international flights. Reservations are subject to cancellation and passengers may not be eligible for denied boarding compensation when check-in is less than 10 minutes prior to departure time of domestic flights and 40 minutes prior to departure time of international flights or if after having checked-in for a flight a passenger is not on board the aircraft at least 5 minutes before departure.

GENERAL CARGO SERVICE is available at all Northwest cities except New York's LaGuardia airport. For information call your local Northwest air freight information number.

IN-FLIGHT ENTERTAINMENT is available on 747 and DC10 flights with Multi-Channel Stereo on most segments, and wide-screen movies on international and Hawaii flights. There is a \$3.00 charge per person for coach, economy or thrift passengers on international segments and between the U.S. mainland and Alaska or Hawaii.

PETS may be shipped in kennels placed in the cargo compartment. Some small household pets may be carried in the passenger cabin in a kennel which will fit underneath the seat. Kennels are available at most Northwest Orient Airport ticket offices. You may obtain all necessary information from any Northwest Office.

RESERVATIONS: You may obtain reservations for any flight by telephoning, wiring, or writing any Northwest Orient office, a travel agent, or hotel transportation desk. If your plans change, please cancel your reservation as far in advance as possible so that other passengers can be accommodated. Reconfirmation of return or continuing reservations on international flights is required at least 72 hours prior to scheduled departure.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR DEPARTURES, ARRIVALS, AND CONNECTIONS: Northwest Orient is not responsible for damages resulting from failure of aircraft to depart or arrive on scheduled time, or failure to make connections with other flights.

SCHEDULES AND FARES: All schedules and fares are subject to change without notice and Northwest Orient is not responsible for errors therein.

SMOKING is permitted in the special smoking sections on all Northwest Orient aircraft and is restricted to cigarette smoking only. Special sections for pipe smokers are provided on 747 aircraft.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Boarding procedures for international travel require that you must possess valid passports, visas, certificates, or any other documents as required by the countries involved.
